Call to Order: Crystal Starr, Chair, called the meeting to order at 12:12 p.m.

During the opening remarks, Starr thanked members who attended the Office Open House Event last Thursday in spite of the heat. Half of the staff was unable to make it because they had COVID or other significant issues. For that reason, Starr gave special thanks to Ronnie, Diana, Skeet, Ryan, Allen, Rod and Mackenzie for making guests feel welcome and appreciated. She also thanked all of the Council Members in attendance today, especially those who are here in person and helped us reach quorum. Starr then called for a Moment of Reflection.

Dena Hughes said that she is a woman living with HIV and the CEO of Triangle Area Network in Beaumont. TAN began in 1987 as Triangle AIDS Network and is the oldest ASO in southeast Texas. They became an FQHC in 2016 and now provide a full range of services to the southeast Texas community. She says that the rural area needs more attention and needs to be included in the larger conversation. She is irritated that EHE is only in the one area when folks travel the I-10 corridor so there needs to be a closer collaboration between what we're doing and if nothing else, when you have a conversation make sure to at least have someone from the rural community at the table. She introduced John Dixon, Board Chair of TAN Healthcare.

Cordella Lyon, emergency department at Baptist Hospital in Beaumont. She said they do routine HIV testing and provider linkage to Ryan White care. They would like the opportunity work with Houston and to share resources and ideas to help end the epidemic.

Call to Order: Crystal Starr, Chair, called the meeting to order at 12:12 p.m.

During the opening remarks, Starr thanked members who attended the Office Open House Event last Thursday in spite of the heat. Half of the staff was unable to make it because they had COVID or other significant issues. For that reason, Starr gave special thanks to Ronnie, Diana, Skeet, Ryan, Allen, Rod and Mackenzie for making guests feel welcome and appreciated. She also thanked all of the Council Members in attendance today, especially those who are here in person and helped us reach quorum. Starr then called for a Moment of Reflection.

Dena Hughes said that she is a woman living with HIV and the CEO of Triangle Area Network in Beaumont. TAN began in 1987 as Triangle AIDS Network and is the oldest ASO in southeast Texas. They became an FQHC in 2016 and now provide a full range of services to the southeast Texas community. She says that the rural area needs more attention and needs to be included in the larger conversation. She is irritated that EHE is only in the one area when folks travel the I-10 corridor so there needs to be a closer collaboration between what we're doing and if nothing else, when you have a conversation make sure to at least have someone from the rural community at the table. She introduced John Dixon, Board Chair of TAN Healthcare.

Cordella Lyon, emergency department at Baptist Hospital in Beaumont. She said they do routine HIV testing and provider linkage to Ryan White care. They would like the opportunity work with Houston and to share resources and ideas to help end the epidemic.
